very year, I like to do something I've never done before, just to challenge myself. In 2008, I installed a toilet. In 2009, I accepted the position of Convention Director for the TLR's 2010 convention.

Both of these tasks had their challenges and pitfalls. If you did something wrong doing either of these things, there was a very good chance that you could wind up covered with something wet and stinky.

Thankfully, on the first task, I had my father-in-law to guide me through it, instructing me on the phone from Queens, NY, while I struggled in my bathroom in Winnipeg.

On the second task, I had a great organizing committee and many volunteers who were all dedicated to making this convention a success! And succeed we did! With a total of I46 registrants, this was the largest TLR convention we've had in over five years! We held a dozen clinics, and had 20 layout hops!

We didn't get stinky, but we sure got wet! Over four inches of rain fell that weekend. It was a record breaking, once-in-a-lifetime storm, the worst one we've had in 50 years! There was a total of 13 hours of thunderstorms on Friday and Saturday. That's a six month supply of thunderstorm hours in one weekend!

Underpasses turned into swimming pools. Farmers' fields were turned into lakes. Dozens of trees



were uprooted. Over 500 basements were flooded. There were power outages in many parts of the city, and many traffic lights were knocked out of commission. Some of the city's pumping stations failed. The Red River rose over ten feet.

However, we had a great view of the thunderstorm as we watched it from the passenger cars of the Prairie Dog Central Railway. You rarely get a chance to witness a thunderstorm of that magnitude across the broad, flat plain of the Canadian prairie! We also found out first-hand

The elections were held at the general membership meeting on Sunday. Alan Saatkamp, President, resigned to take over The Fusee editorship this fall. Jim Bernier, Contest Director, and Jay Davis, Secretary, have had

their five year terms expire. Paul Ullrich and I had our one year term up for re-election. This put five positions up for election with seven candidates running. The result was something a bookie in Vegas would have wanted to put odds on! Jay Manning outdistanced the other four candidates by one vote. Tied with the same amount of votes were Paul Ullrich, Paul Gerry, Mike Engler, and myself.

Officers will be elected, and by-laws drafted and will be presented for final approval there. Our first task will be building a portable layout to take to model train shows.

President's Report Alan Saatkamp told the Board that it had been an enjoyable year, getting to know the TLR Board members better. He thanked everyone involved in making the Winnipeg convention a reality. He credited the talented and dedicated Board members for helping make his last year in office a success. Alan mentioned the resignation of Gerry Leone as FUSEE editor thanking Gerry for his work on the Board and as editor. Alan tendered his resignation so that he could take up the position of editor effective as of the Winter issue of THE FUSEE.

<u>Vice President's Report</u>. Gerry Miller reported that all but one Division had returned its Division certification papers but he was confident that it would be turned in shortly.

Treasurer's Report Dave Hamilton handed out a full report of all the Region's finances. He informed the Board that the region still has eight Certificates of Deposit through Wells Fargo.

<u>Contest Director's Report</u> Contest Director, Jim Bernier reviewed last year's contest entries and points earned at the Hutchinson convention. He thanked all who had entered the contest over the past five years for their great models and photos.

Public Relations Director/Fusee editor's Report
Gerry Leone submitted a report for Public Relations. He
again put together promotional video for this year's convention and posted it on YouTube. Because of delays in getting video footage of the Assiniboine Valley Railroad and
Prairie Dog Central Railroad, the video had to be posted

later than past conventions. The video was viewed approximately 375 times to this date which is 75 more views than last year's Hutchinson convention video has to date The convention was highlighted in the winter and spring issues of THE FUSEE, with convention articles by Convention Director Paul Ullrich and Ron Einarson.

During his editor report Gerry mentioned handing in his editorship resignation last fall. The fall issue of THE FUSEE will be his final issue. This will conclude six years of editing the newsletter. Alan Saatkamp will take over the editorship, effective on the Winter 2010/2011 issue. Gerry expressed his deep appreciation of Alan's willingness to step in to fill that position and on behalf of the entire Region, he thanked Alan.

Gerry reported that the number of Fusee subscriptions is at about 265. It's important to note that this is up from 2008/2009 figures of about 230 per issue. This year's spring issue was mailed to all NMRA members within the TLR's boundaries and totaled 510 issues. The Canadian figure jumped from 12 to 57, obviously, because of the convention. THE Fusee continues to carry paid ads. The Luce Line club purchased a full year's worth of 1/4 page ads, Brass Car Sides has again purchased a year's worth of 1/16 page ads. The Spud Valley Train Show renewed their ad. The Granite City train show has purchased another full year of ads. Fagan's Hobby Shop purchased a year long 1/16 page ad which runs out with the summer issue. One year of ads pays for one issue's printing. The subscription fees pay for printing on the other three issues, with a surplus.

Convention Director's Report
Paul Ullrich submitted
the Convention Director's report. He said he had spent the
last year working on this year's convention at Winnipeg.
He had a lot of help from many others to whom he
thanked and recognized. He hoped that everyone was
enjoying the convention so far.

The Achievement Program Report was submitted by John Hotvet and presented by Dave Hamilton. This year was a very slow year for the Achievement Program. They only awarded two achievement certificates and no Golden Spikes. Two AP certificates were awarded to Alan

that 100- year-old passenger cars have a tendency to leak in a few places.

We were blessed with the occasional dry spells in some of the most important places.



The rain miraculously stopped just before our extra fare excursions arrived at Portage La Prairie and Lower Fort Garry. The sun even came out when we toured the facilities at the Prairie Dog Central! No rain fell during Sunday's layout hops. There was yet another downpour during the clinics, but we were all inside







That Mysterious Canadian Cookie

They were good sports about it. Maybe all the potato salad and pulled pork lulled them into a sense of security. But, after a few bites, they realized they weren't just eating a chocolate cookie. There was some definite mumblings - "Coconut? Whipped cream?" - while they ate dessert. They even asked a few locals "What's in this?"

So, to answer their questions, and to add a little something to everyone else's files, here's the recipe.

Nanaimo Bars

Bottom Layer:

1/2 cup unsalted butter

1/4 cup sugar

I/4 cup cocoa

I egg, beaten

I I/4 cups graham wafer crumbs

1/2 cup finely chopped almonds

I cup coconut

Second layer:

1/2 cup unsalted butter

3 tablespoons cream

2 tablespoons vanilla custard powder (Bird's is available in most stores)

2 cups icing sugar

Third layer:

4 (I oz.) squares semi-sweet chocolate

2 tablespoons unsalted butter

Bottom Layer:

Melt first 3 ingredients in the top of a double boiler. Add egg and stir to cook and thicken. Remove from heat. Stir in crumbs, coconut and nuts. Press firmly into an ungreased 8x8 inch pan.

Second layer:

Cream butter, cream, custard powder and icing sugar together. Beat until light. Spread over bottom layer.

Third layer:

Melt chocolate and butter over low heat or in microwave. Cool. When cooled but still liquid pour over second layer. Chill in refrigerator.

<u>Division Reports</u> **Dakota Southeastern** - Jay Manning reported that their Division membership has remained fairly constant in the last year. Last June there was a rail fan picnic at Hills, MN next to the BNSF main line. It brought together members of the DSED, PLD, and Sioux Valley Model Engineers. It was a great day for all and will hopefully become an annual event. Again this past fall DSED hosted a day at the Ronning Branch Library in Sioux Falls. This day included several clinics with special emphasis towards children and Alan Saatkamp's switching layout. This event was attended by over 75 people. In October they had their annual open house tour, which was well attended. November bought the DSED modular layout to participate in the annual, Sioux Valley Model Engineers Society Trains at

Minnesota River Valley - Terry Davis reported that they have seventeen NMRA members, which is down from about thirty a few years ago. The PLD members held a drawing for those planning to attend the Winnipeg convention and drew Jay Davis' name to receive a \$200 grant to help defray costs of attending the meet. South Red River Valley - Duane Durr talked about the 32nd Annual Spud Valley Hobby Show to be held on October 17 at the Ramada Plaza Suites in Fargo, ND.

Alan asked for a motion to accept all board and superintendent reports. A motion was made by Jim Bernier and was seconded by Gerry Leone. Motion carried.

New Business Gerry Miller outlined the 2011 convention to be held in Dubuque, IA. Future updates will be in THE FUSEE. It was decided that there would be no monetary split between the TLR and the local Division. The TLR will be responsible for this convention.

Next, Jay Manning made a proposal for a 2012 Sioux Falls convention. He said they wanted to split the costs/profits 50/50 with the TLR. More details to come in THE FUSEE. A motion by Gerry Leone was made to accept the proposal for the 2012 convention. Jim Bernier seconded this. Motion carried.

They wanted to see what the Board thought of this idea and with the Board's permission would like to look into it further to see what the cost of having everything scanned would be.A motion to look at the costs of this venture was made by Jim Bernier. Dave Hamilton seconded the motion.

Treasurer, Dave Hamilton reported that the CD's were not bringing in a lot of interest and wanted to know what the Board thought about moving some of the money into other places that would offer higher returns. A discussion was held and people present with financial backgrounds suggested that the CD's would eventually yield higher returns as the economy starts to turn around. A motion to table the rearrangement of finances was made by Gerry Miller. It was seconded by Paul Ullrich. Motion carried.

Gerry Leone mentioned giving the profits of the Winnipeg Convention to the No. I Northern Division. A discussion was held in which it was questioned if any profits would be made. This idea was tabled and to be placed on the agenda for the October Board meeting.
